Reflections from Fr. Dennis

Dear Friends and Fellow Parishioners:

The revelation of God's being a Holy Trinity comes to us as a direct result of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Our Jewish ancestors in faith are the "Chosen People" because they are the people among all the races of humankind who were chosen by God to embrace monotheism. And it took over a millennium of struggle with God (recall that "Israel:" means "the one who struggled with God") before it was absolutely clear in the mind of all Jews that there is only one God. The essence of Jewish faith is the proclamation: "Hear O Israel, the Lord our God is One." The birth of the Messiah was God's further "coming out" – i.e. revealing a deeper level of the mystery of Who God Is.

On Pentecost, the missing piece in the puzzle of who Jesus IS finally fell into place for the Apostles. They realized that God not only planned to SEND the Messiah: God BECAME the Messiah. Jesus is the very face of God. If we ever wondered what God would be like if God became one of us, we have the answer in Jesus. So Jesus IS God. But Jesus always referred to God as "Abba" (that is, Papa, or Daddy)., and He taught us the "Our Father" as the perfect prayer to pray to our Father, praying together with Jesus. So the Father is God, and Jesus is the incarnation of God. The Apostles had no doubt about the divinity of the Holy Spirit, because they were suddenly and permanently filled with all the gifts of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. They no longer hesitated publicly to proclaim Christ as the risen Son of God. The Spirit was like a blessed contagion which spread in the hearing. So thousands are said to have been baptized that day. These are devout monotheistic Jews who are now proclaiming that the Father, the Son, and the Spirit are all personal facets of who God IS. No logic would convince monotheists that their one God is also Father, Son, and Spirit. The Holy Spirit moved them to proclaim this with conviction.

How this is possible is a great mystery. Remember when we heard the word "mystery" used by the nuns, if you went to Catholic school? A preadolescent's mind considered it a victory to pose a question in religion class that sister could not answer. She, however, was prepared for such juvenile behavior. Her go-to response was always the same: "It's a mystery." The Trinity certainly falls into that category. However, the Christians DID TRY to understand what they could. And the mystery of love provided a big clue for them. Whenever Jesus talked about marriage, He always referred back to the passage in Genesis where we are told about the man and the woman leaving their own families of origin and then becoming one flesh. The two becoming one is a great metaphor for love. But we understand that it is only a metaphor, because, no matter how hard two people try to do so, they will never become identically one flesh. The laws of time and space won't allow it. But the yearning for such unity is deeply in our spiritual DNA because we are creatures in the image of a God, Who, according to St. John, IS LOVE! Love is God's identity: for us, it is a process and a goal. So we can glimpse the reflection of the Holy Trinity when we see people in love. Love is our goal in life, because union with God is the deep-seeded yearning and the goal of our life's journey.

BIBLICAL ROOTS OF THE TRINITY


Today's readings show some biblical roots of what Christians would later call the Trinity. Proverbs showcases the role of Wisdom in the work of creation, portrayed as a reality outside of God but integrated into God's work of forming the heavens and the earth. We join the psalmist in sharing Wisdom's delight in God's handiwork: "O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth" (Psalm 8:2). In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes of peace with God through Jesus, and the love of God received through the Holy Spirit, distinguishing God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit while also displaying their abiding unity. Finally, in the farewell discourse from John's Gospel, Jesus—who had earlier spoken of himself as Son of the Father—promises his friends that they will receive the Spirit of truth that will teach and guide them after his departure.

TRINITY SUNDAY REFLECTION from St. Athanasius

"It will not be out of place to consider the ancient tradition, teaching and faith of the Catholic Church, which was revealed by the Lord, proclaimed by the apostles and guarded by the fathers. For upon this faith the Church is built, and if anyone were to lapse from it, he would no longer be a Christian either in fact or in name.

We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity there is no intrusion of any alien element or of anything from outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energizing reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the holy Trinity is preserved. Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is *above all things and through all things and in all things*. God is *above all things* as Father, for he is principle and source; he is *through all things* through the Word; and he is *in all things* in the Holy Spirit.

Writing to the Corinthians about spiritual matters, Paul traces all reality back to one God, the Father, saying: *Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone.* Even the gifts that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs also to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father. Similarly, when the Spirit dwells in us, the Word who bestows the Spirit is in us too, and the Father is present in the Word. This is the meaning of the text: *My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him.* For where the light is, there also is the radiance; and where the radiance is, there too are its power and its resplendent grace."





WHAT IS THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL?

“The National Eucharistic Revival (*“My flesh for the life of the world” Jn. 6:51*) is a three-year initiative sponsored by the Bishops of the United States to inspire and prepare the People of God to be formed, healed, converted, united, and sent out to a hurting and hungry world through a renewed encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist – the source and summit of our Catholic faith. **The Revival officially begins on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ next week and its milestone event will be a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN, July 17 -21, 2024.** The National Eucharistic Revival and National Eucharistic Congress are a direct response to the Holy Father’s call for a “pastoral and missionary conversion which cannot leave things as they presently are’ so that the Church in the United States might be permanently in a state of mission.” (Evangelii Gaudium, #25).

“This Eucharistic movement seeks to bring together clergy, religious, laity, apostolates, movements, and parish and diocesan leaders to spur momentum, collaboration, and lasting impact for the renewal of the Catholic Church in the U.S. over the next three years. Each year will have a strategic focus for formation and missionary discipleship.”

All are welcome and are encouraged to come as All Saints Parish marks the beginning of the National Eucharistic Revival with the Corpus Christi Procession (or Adoration in the Holy Family Room if inclement weather) at the end of the 10 a.m. Mass next Sunday here at St. Isaac Jogues Church. We realize it is also Father’s Day and want you to know that the Procession/Adoration and Benediction will be finished no later than Noon.
