FATHER'S DAY, 2013 "WHAT ORPHANS DO"

There's a true story about Clifton Webb. He was a versatile character actor whose roles included Mr. Belvidere, John Philip Sousa and a father of twelve in "**Cheaper by the Dozen.**" Clifton Webb, off the sound stage, was a great host and a refined gentleman. He had a great admiration and affection for his mother, Maybelle. Maybelle died when she was in her 90s and Clifton was 70. The witty and gregarious Clifton went into deep mourning. Almost everybody respected his grief. Noel Coward was a notable exception.

He commented:

"Poor Clifton, it's so difficult to be an orphan at 70!"

The story came to mind for me shortly after my own father's death in January. It didn't seem funny anymore. There I was . . . An orphan at 69! My father and I did not have a sentimental relationship. In some ways, we were a little like Frazier and his dad. It wasn't home unless there was a dog, a conspicuous rocker or lounge chair amid the clutter of antiques and old photos. He and I did not agree on how a steak should be cooked or the use of sage in holiday dressing. Once a parishioner asked me, "Do you hug you father?" I answered, "You've got to be kidding . . . We don't do that!" If the occasion called for it, we shook hands. That was that.

If there was one thing we did with ease, it was TALK. I think that is the thing I miss

most. My father and I talked almost every night . . . From 10 p.m. to? What did we talk about? Relatives, politics, old Movies and the good or bad old days. I'll never forget having a "senior moment" trying to identify the rich kid in "The Loves of Dobie Gillis." As I was about to hang up, I predicted that I'd call him back in a few minutes when the name would come to me. I called in less than five minutes with the right answer - - Warren Beatty!


Now, every night at 10, I feel something is missing. Facing a "Fatherless Father's Day" was made easier when a former neighbor called to invite me to a Father's Day Barbecue at her house. My father and I had been guests there a year ago. They were and are good friends as well as neighbors. As we chatted on the telephone, I sensed another bond. She confided: "It will be a strange Father's Day without children!" Neither of her daughters were able to come home for Father's Day. I was fatherless. My friends were childless. It made me think of those melancholy lines of poet Marianne Moore:

"The world's an orphan's home. Shall we never have peace without sorrow?"

TO ALL ST. ISAAC JOGUES PARISHIONERS

From its apostolic foundation, the purpose of the Church is to TEACH.

*“Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.”
(Matthew 28:19-20)*

This Christ-given and Christ-centered commission must continue. Despite challenges --even hostility-- from the dominant culture, we cannot abandon our responsibility to support Catholic Education. We are all too familiar with stories of dwindling numbers at Mass, Catholic School closings because of low enrollment and higher tuition costs. Some parishes have been unable to finance the cost of Catholic education or maintain Church property. In our time, we have seen the decline of a core understanding of our Catholic faith and tradition. Catholic education for our children and ongoing faith formation for teens and adults is critical. Every parish --our own included-- needs to improve present programs and find more effective ways to catechize in our contemporary culture. For this to happen, your support is desperately needed!

After months of dialogue and work with Catholic Education specialists - the Archdiocese of Chicago announced the launch of a new Campaign, **TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS**. The campaign seeks to raise \$350 million for Catholic education and faith formation over a three year period, from 2013 - 2016. The Archdiocese is currently working with major donors to raise \$100 million. As of the official launch they have secured over \$80 million in donations and pledges! The total goal for parishes is \$250 million. 60% of the funds raised by the parish remain in the parish, available for our use almost immediately. All parishes participate, joining in “waves.” St. Isaac Jogues will launch the campaign in January 2014 in Wave II. As part of the parish launch, our goal for the Annual Catholic Appeal is waived for 2014.

Over the next several weeks and months, you will see bulletin articles with additional details, hear messages from Francis Cardinal George, and be called on for your support. **WE** have much work to do, and must work together. Please include campaign success in your prayers and *listen* for how you might be *called* to help.



COLLECTION ENVELOPE CHANGES COMING!

As part of our continuing effort to manage expenses, we've just completed an audit of parishioner envelope use. The review revealed that over 300 families have not used their envelopes in many years. These families will no longer receive envelope packets. In addition, we learned that bi-monthly mailing of envelope packets would also help us cut our envelope costs which are approximately \$9,000 annually. After discussion with the Finance committee, the bi-monthly approach was approved and will be implemented effective August, 2013. **You will receive your August & September collection envelopes including those for special collections in one packet.**

Each subsequent packet will contain **two months** of collection envelopes. We expect a **30%** savings from these two small changes. If you are or were an envelope “user” and don't receive your bi-monthly packet, please call the rectory at 847- 967-1060.

Religious Education

Registration for the 2013-2014 Religious Education Program for Kindergarten through Confirmation Year II has begun! Please send in or drop off the form that was mailed to returning families or if you are new to the Religious Education Program, please call the RE Office, 847/966-1180, to set up a time to come in and fill out registration forms. You will also need to bring a copy of each child's baptismal certificate if they were not baptized here at St. Isaac Jogues.

Kindergarten classes meet on Sundays, 10:30-11:30 a.m. and Grs. 1 – Confirmation Year II meet on Mondays, 6:45-8:00 p.m. Families are strongly encouraged to have their children come each year as no one year suffices in providing what is important for a strong faith foundation. Students preparing for sacraments must attend for the two immediate years prior to receiving each sacrament. If families have children with special needs or who have not received their sacraments, we would be happy to meet with you and discuss options. There is tuition and applicable book and sacrament fees. Families with financial concerns are encouraged to talk with us as **no child is denied religious education because of finances**. All are welcome!

The United States Bishops have again called for a *Fortnight for Freedom*, a two-week period of prayer and action, to address many current challenges to religious liberty, including the August 1, 2013, deadline for religious organizations to comply with the HHS mandate; Supreme Court rulings that could redefine marriage in June, and religious liberty concerns in areas such as immigration and humanitarian services. The fortnight begins this Friday, June 21 (the vigil of the feasts of St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher) and culminate with Independence Day, July 4.

Here at St. Isaac Jogues Parish we will offer opportunities for prayer, learning and action during the two-week period. At daily and weekend Masses we will pray the "Prayer for the Protection of Religious Liberty" at the end of the intercessions; a 14-day booklet with readings and questions is available at the doors of the church TODAY (and used for the discussion days); along with a variety of prayer opportunities and a movie night. Weekday evening offerings will begin at 7:00 p.m. The schedule is as follows:

- June 22-23 Prayer at Mass
- June 24 Religious Liberty discussion using daily readings/questions for Week 1 Sessions at 8:30 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- June 25 Holy Hour & Benediction
- June 26 Showing of the movie "For Greater Glory"
- June 27 Mass in honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help (Mary, our Mother, is patron of the United States)
- June 28 Patriotic Rosary
- June 29-30 Prayer at Mass
- July 1 Religious Liberty discussion using daily readings/questions for Week 2 Sessions at 8:30 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- July 2 Holy Hour & Benediction
- July 3 No evening activity planned
- July 4 Patriotic Rosary, 8 a.m.; Independence Day Mass, 9 a.m.
- July 5 First Friday Adoration and Devotions, 7-10 p.m.

The call of the Gospel reminds us that responsible citizenship is a virtue and participation in the political life is a moral obligation. This obligation is rooted in our baptismal commitment to follow Jesus Christ and to bear Christian witness in all we do. We urge you to participate in some way during the Fortnight for Freedom!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

June is the month most associated with weddings in the United States. Wedding celebrations always require some savvy planning, and people who have a talent for hospitality in the mix. At the wedding feast at Cana, the mother of Jesus was recruited to deal with some of the details of the banquet, and when a very understandable crisis arose, she did what she could to rescue the party. Anyone who has ever run out of ice, dessert, or table settings knows the stress!

Slowly, the memory of Jesus Christ's blessing of this marriage feast led the Church to form a way to bless marriages. A thousand years ago weddings migrated from the family home to the doors of the church, where the celebration was held in public view. From this practice came a prayer called the "Nuptial Blessing," one of the most solemn prayers in our tradition. It is very much like the prayers by which baptismal water and chrism are consecrated, the ordination prayer over a priest, and the Eucharistic Prayers over bread and wine. Four hundred fifty years ago, weddings moved inside the church building. All of this gives married couples good reason to celebrate their anniversaries well, especially with the clinking of glasses filled with good wine.


