



**"QUO VADIS, DOMINE?"****A Reflection on the Roman Martyrs**

On June 29, the Church celebrates the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul. On the following day (June 30) it honors the First Martyrs of Rome. It is a large "canvas" on which to present the heroic witness of the Early Church.

When I was a young child, our family library included an old, but colorfully illustrated "Book of the Saints". It had belonged to my great-grandmother. Even though the book was in Polish, I was fascinated by the pictures. I suppose instruments of torture and the painful deaths depicted were part of that fascination!

When I was eight years old, my family and I saw the MGM Technicolor epic, **Quo Vadis**. Based on the 1895 novel by Henryk Sienkiewicz, the film was a spectacle that both entertained and inspired. If you have seen **Quo Vadis** you will never forget Peter Ustinov's high "camp" portrayal of mad emperor Nero, who considered arson a fine art. He burns Rome, and to escape the fury of the rioting populace, blames the Christians.

While **Quo Vadis** is a love story about Vinicius, a Roman patrician, and Lygia, a captive foreign princess, it is much more a chronicle of the first great persecution of Christianity. Important to the story are Saints Peter and Paul. Sienkiewicz's account is historically solid and reverent. The increasing perils of being a Christian, at a crucial point in the story, lead Peter to leave Rome to preserve his life. The incident in the novel and the film is based on a legend. As Peter and a young follower travel the **Via Appia Antica**, the apostle has a radiant

vision of Jesus going, in the opposite direction, to Rome. Peter asks "**QUO VADIS, DOMINE?**" ("Where are you going, Lord?") Jesus responds: "I am going to Rome to be crucified anew!" With that, Peter turns around. Returning to Rome, he is condemned and sentenced to crucifixion. Peter protests he is unworthy to die as the Master died, and so the executioners crucify him upside down.

**Quo Vadis** rather graphically describes the faithful deaths of the early martyrs of Rome. They go to the arena to be fed to wild beasts or to the gardens of Nero to be crucified, then set ablaze. They forgive their enemies and sing hymns on their way to their deaths. At one point, Nero asks "Why are they still singing?" The torments of the first martyrs are corroborated in an account from Roman historian, Tacitus:

The courageous example of Saints Peter and Paul and the

*"Mockery of every sort  
accompanied their deaths."*

*Covered with the skins of beasts, they were torn  
part by dogs and perished, or were nailed to  
crosses, or were doomed to the flames and  
burnt, to serve as nightly illumination when  
daylight expired."*

First Martyrs of Rome has impressed us for almost 2,000 years. But the "Age of Martyrs" continues today. The senseless, inhumane slaughter of Christian men, women, and children by the fanatics is martyrdom. But the "Blood of Martyrs" remains the seed of our Christian harvest of Faith. In our turbulent, confused world, the old "madness" of persecution wears new masks, but it unleashes the same evil upon the world!

The witness of ancient and modern martyrs reminds us of that vision of Peter on **Via Appia Antica**. When the faithful are persecuted, Christ is mocked and scourged. In those who die for their faith, Christ is crucified anew!

Almost thirty years ago I actually visited the chapel on Appian Way called "**Quo Vadis?**" There, imbedded in the stone floor, are footprints. The tour guides will tell you: "These are the footprints of Christ!" They may or may not be, but they are a vivid sign of how near Christ is to all who suffer for the faith.

Our parish is observing the fortnight with a variety of activities. If you haven’t participated in an event yet, we welcome you to do so this week:

**Daily:** Pray the Prayer for Religious Liberty. Keep up with the news!

**June 29: Coffee and Discussion** at 8:30 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on articles – “Continuing the Search for Religious Liberty: The Contribution of Dignitatis Humanae” (regarding the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Vatican II’s Declaration on Religious Liberty) and “Religious Liberty and the Practice of Charity”. **Both articles are available at the doors of the church today** to read in preparation.

**July 1: Movie – Jerzy Popieluszko: Messenger of the Truth**, 7 p.m., HFR. Documentary narrated by Martin Sheen about Polish martyr and 20<sup>th</sup> century hero, Blessed Jerzy Popieluszko, chaplain of the Solidarity movement in Poland, who was murdered in 1984 at the age of 37 by the Communists for speaking the truth about human dignity and rights. His strong faith, love and courage mobilizes the nation to stand united against the Communist regim in Poland.

**July 3: First Friday devotions for the healing and guidance of our nation**, 6-9 p.m., church



### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The premier poet of the English language, Geoffrey Chaucer, introduced one of his most beloved characters, the "Wife of Bath," by this telling remark: "Husbands at church door she had five." Four times widowed, she was setting off on a pilgrimage, notably without number five. The church door is a curious detail, pointing to the fourteenth-century wedding custom of marrying on the porch

of the parish church. The goal was to give maximum publicity to the consent of the groom and bride, and so consent was moved from the bride's home to a public venue. The priest would stand in the doorway and begin by sprinkling the couple with holy water. He needed to make sure they weren't too closely related and give them some instruction. He would direct the groom to pay the bride's family a dowry, and then announce the monetary amounts to the interested passersby. Only then would the

guests enter the church for the wedding Mass, during which the bride and groom would hold lighted candles.

The gradual move from home to church and the shift from the bride's father to the priest's authority helped to protect the freedom of brides who weren't quite as confident as the Wife of Bath.


