God's Kingdom and good seeds!

When we speak of God's kingdom as Jesus often referred to in his preaching, *"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field.,"* Jesus uses the parable to speak about heaven and to help us understand its meaning more closely. The Jews had their expectation and for hundreds of years, they have been expecting God to restore the glory of Israel and do away with their enemies. When John the Baptist came and Jesus followed preaching about the Kingdom; that it was at hand, it was certainly understood in these terms of expectation. However, the kingdom initiated by Jesus is not the earthly kingdom that was widely inferred from the Old Testament prophesies. It is a spiritual kingdom that is now growing in the hearts of men and women, and it will find its fulfillment in the eventual sovereign rule of God and defeat of all evil. Those people, who choose to belong to God's kingdom and serve Him, are those who are destined to inherit eternal life in God's presence.

Your life is your "field." What are those good seeds that we need to possess to inherit the Kingdom of God? Do we need to look in terms of a farmer preparing the right seeds to be sown in order to reap a good harvest? You sow what you reap and so you always get more when you sow God's ways. Take the first step by being faithful in planting the first seed and you will be rewarded more than you ever expected it. Don't expect a harvest of something you have never planted. You can't reap before you sow. Let us not deceive ourselves, but take responsibility for our behavior. The presence of the weeds in the field speaks about the evil that exist in our society today. One needs to work hard to destroy evil. We need to be patient like the owner in the field who allows the weeds to exist along with the wheat simply because in trying to uproot the weeds it would damage the crop. God's kingdom is filled with works of love, joy, peace, happiness, understanding, commitment and total devotion to God's word.

Your commitment to God's word should not rest on conditions such as "If God would help me close this major business deal, I am really going to start giving to the church." We must start from where we are at this point. The seeds to be sown in life are many. In order not to lose sight of the Kingdom of heaven and yield fruits in plenty, we need to focus on God's Kingdom of heaven and strive to sow good seeds that yields a harvest of joy and caring for our fellow man. We need to reach out to the needy, care for the sick and elderly, foster brotherhood instead of hate, thereby reaping good seeds in God's Kingdom.


