

AWFUL TRUTH OR AMAZING GRACE?

Why We Need a New Evangelization



Few things are more inspiring, and consoling, for a pastor than to hear the story of a conversion or return to the Catholic Church. In either scenario, one cannot escape the "God factor." God's mysterious presence is so real and active, yet so easy for us humans to miss or ignore! The pundits of pop culture have taken polls and surveys, and have judged ignorance or indifference to religious practice as "decline and fall." They seem very certain of their opinion. Their diagnosis is a post mortem. Of course, it would be foolish for believers to ignore disturbing facts. For example, it has been estimated that 23% of U. S. Catholics attend Mass each week! The 77% who are absent include our own relatives and friends. Surprisingly, the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate studied the rationale for missing Mass, and found it is not related to controversial issues. The six reasons for Catholics not attending Mass regularly are:

- 1. they have busy schedules and lack time,
- 2. they have family responsibilities,
- 3. they have health problems or disabilities,
- 4. they have conflicts at work,
- 5. they do not believe missing Mass is a sin, or
- 6. believe that they are not very religious people

These six reasons reflect the tempo of modern life and cultural changes. Secularism, individualism, and materialism are pervasive in the changing attitudes toward religious practice. What Catholics put first in their lives very often comes from a values disorientation. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI was clear in his denunciation of relativism and the tendency to treat religion as a private matter.

He said:

"Only when their faith permeates every aspect of their lives do Christians become truly open to the transforming power of the Gospel"...

Moreover, God remains not just a matter of interest, but the fulfillment of our deepest needs.

"Without God, who alone bestows upon us what we by ourselves cannot attain, our lives are ultimately empty."



When the need for God and the Church surface for Catholics who distanced themselves from both, sometimes fear and embarrassment stand in the way of returning. There are many different stories about "reverts" (cradle Catholics returning to the Catholic Church). Online, **About.com Catholicism** provides the testimony of those who had left the Church and have returned.

Key questions asked are:


- 1. Were you a cradle Catholic or Convert?
- 2. How old were you when you left the Catholic Church?
- 3. How old when you returned?
- 4. Why did you leave the Catholic Church?
- 5. Why did you return to Catholicism?
- 6. Advice?

Reading stories of "converts" and "reverts" and reflecting on their advice can enlighten others and encourage the lapsed especially to begin their own "journey" back to the Church.

From my experience, I know that there is no greater motivation to return to the practice of the Catholic faith than Catholics who know what they believe and show what they believe!

Consider this article the first of several on the need for a NEW EVANGELIZATION.



If you have questions, please call the **Religious Education Office at 847/966-1180**. We look forward to the opportunity to help all families raise their children in our Catholic faith!




First Friday



MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN

"The Second Vatican Council taught us that the Church is missionary by her very nature. It is a non-negotiable. We can't choose not to give mission pride-of-place in Catholic life. One way in which we can increase our awareness of mission is through the *Missionary Cooperation Plan*.

Here in the Archdiocese of Chicago and in diocese across the country the mission appeals take place during the summer. In Chicago, the Office of Mission Education for the New Evangelization makes the missionary assignments. We typically get 300-400 applications from organizations, diocese and religious communities that need prayerful and financial support for various mission projects in which they are engaged. The aim of each project is to make Christ known and loved. Some are direct evangelization efforts and others seek to reveal Christ through projects to help people have a more wholesome way of life.

The Missionary Cooperation Plan (MCP) is a way for Catholics to learn about the Church's missionary efforts throughout the world. Even if your parish is supporting a parish, school, or other project in one part of the world, the missionary who makes an appeal at your parish helps to make you aware of what is happening in another part of the globe.

Every year the Archdiocese of Chicago welcomes missionaries from India, Africa, Asia, South America and the Pacific Islands as well as U.S. representatives of mission societies. The funds they collect never remain in the USA. Your donations are sent to the Office of Mission Education and we disburse them to the respective mission groups for use in other countries. What this gives us here in the Archdiocese is an opportunity to share in mission throughout the world. Our local presence then becomes global.

The MCP helps us in another way too. As we learn about how others engage in mission, we learn that to be on mission is our baptismal vocation -- whether we are called to go on mission in another country or here in our neighborhood, at work or at school

So welcome the missionary to your parish, open yourself to the gift he/she is and allow the Holy Spirit to move you to be on mission wherever you are!"

On August 10-11 St. Isaac Jogues Parish will welcome Fr. Christsanth Mugasha, A. J., who will make the mission appeal on behalf of the Evangelizing Sisters of Mary, a missionary African congregation. Your generosity in the second collection and your prayers will be greatly appreciated.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Apart from the period from Thanksgiving through Christmas, the summer is a favored time for family reunions. We trace family trees and recall our origins. Worship has a family tree as well, and the way we celebrate today has been influenced by various styles and customs through the centuries. We are Western Christians of the Latin Rite. By far, we are the most numerous Western Christians, but there are other ritual families as well. The Archdiocese of Milan in Italy follows the Ambrosian Rite, Toledo in Spain preserves the Mozarabic Rite and the Arab language, and Lyons in France is home to the Gallican Rite. Other liturgical families, such as the Celtic in Ireland and the Sarum England. faded awav after Reformation. Until recent times, members of some ancient religious orders such as Carmelites and Trappists followed a pattern of Mass that varied slightly from the plan observed in Latin Rite parishes.

Isn't the Catholic Church the same everywhere? Not at all. It never has been! The existence of so many liturgical families in the West reminds us that unity, not uniformity, is what the Church seeks to achieve among her children. We are united in faith, but wonderfully diverse in rituals, ceremonies, languages, customs, and spirituality.


