MARYMAS The Nativity of Our Lady



Your birth, O Virgin Mother of God, heralded joy to all the world! - The Divine Office

September 8 marks the celebration of the birthday of the Blessed Virgin. The Roman Calendar celebrates only three birthdays - - Our Lord's, St. John the Baptist's and the Blessed Virgin's. The rationale is that

> it was premature to celebrate a birthday because the rest of the life of a person born on that day was subject to ambiguity . . . it is only possible to celebrate a person's life when he or she has passed beyond that life into death and judgment.

Obviously, we celebrate the Lord's Birth because it was an Incarnation of a Divine Person. Our Lady was Immaculately Conceived and St. John the Baptist freed from Original Sin before Birth. That is why the exceptions were made.

Since the 8th Century, the Nativity of Our Lady has been observed in the Western Church. It has long been associated with the end of the Summer harvesting. In **A Yearbook of Seasons and Celebrations**, Joanna Bogle tells us that September 8 was the date on which all harvesting on the common fields owned by the feudal lord was deemed completed. Peasants could then work on their own small garden plots, where they grew herbs and useful vegetables. To mark the day, there was a great feast, and everyone took a holiday.

In Rome, the Feast of the Nativity of Our Lady was one of the four feasts (Candlemas, Annunciation, Assumption and Nativity) that had a solemn procession from the Church of St. Hadrian to the Basilica of St. Mary Major. The procession included the pope, clergy and laity, all barefoot! It is probable that September 8 was also the anniversary of the dedication of the Basilica of St. Mary Major.

The Feast itself is not traceable to a Biblical account. It seems to have originated from the 2nd Century **Proto-evangelion of James** which does describe the birth and childhood of the Blessed Virgin. In the liturgical traditions of the Western and Eastern Churches, the Nativity of Our Lady is primarily a "redemption feast, a preparation for the Messiah." It is linked with Mary's Mission - to be the Mother of the Savior. That mission is inseparable from Christ. She fully cooperates with God's plan and plays a key role. She is at the apex of the History of Salvation.

In his meditation on the feast, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI captures the substance of why Mary is honored and the mood of rejoicing on the great occasion of Mary's Birth:

> Mary was the gate through which He (Christ) came into the world and not simply the external gateway. She had already conceived Jesus in her heart before she became His mother according to the body, as St. Augustine so meaningfully said. Her soul was the space from which God was able to gain access to humanity..

Let us celebrate Mary's Birth; she is the light and hope of all Christians!


