THE EXULTATION OF THE CROSS
SEPTEMBER 14, 2014

HOLY CROSS SUNDAY:



"When I survey the wondrous Cross . . ."

More than fifty years of involvement in Ecumenism has taught me, among other things, very many hymns! Isaac Watts, the composer of hymns like "O God, Our Help in Ages Past" and "Joy to the World," would draw inspiration from St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians:

"But far be it from me to glory except in the cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ . . ."
(Gal. 6:14)

Watts' hymn, "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" ranks among the best in very rich Protestant tradition. In sound and sense, there is much of a "Good Friday" feeling. But there is also the "glory" of which St. Paul so passionately writes. The Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross lays claim to both the price of Redemption and the fruit of Redemption. The "price" was the sorrow, suffering, the agony of the death on Calvary. The "fruit" of that Sacrifice is God's gift of grace and eternal life. Thus the cross is not so much feared as a symbol of death, but revered as a talisman of life and light. In fact, ancient Christian Art used the Greek anagram to express their vision.

Phōs and Zoë, Light and Life . . .

I recall the Buddhist-Catholic Monastic Dialogue at

Gethsemani Abbey in 1996. With notables like the Dalai Lama participating, it was a remarkable assembly of monks and nuns from both religious traditions. The dialogue had depth and candor. At one point, a Buddhist priest of Jewish-American background, pointed to a Crucifix in the assembly hall and commented:

"When I look at the cross, all I see is suffering, pain and death. I see also the injustice that brought Christ to the Cross . . . What do Catholics see?"

The late Fr. Basil Pennington responded:

"When I look at the cross, I see LOVE!"

There was an unusual quiet that followed Fr. Pennington's simple, faith-inspired answer. Many of us nodded in agreement.

On this Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, we see first and foremost the LOVE of Christ. The Cross does not stand for death, but life. It heralds not defeat, but victory. In the final stanza of Isaac Watts' hymn, we join St. Paul in his enthusiasm for the cross:

*Were the whole realm of nature mine,
That were an offering far too small;
Love so amazing, so divine,
Demands my soul my life my all!*

Ave Crux, spes unica! O hail the cross our only hope!

We're busy working with contractors to repair boilers and plumbing to make sure we're ready for the cold weather months ahead. We have received several calls and inquiries about donations. Many parishioners continue to fulfill their pledge to the campaign. Yet, when the next notice is received, all donations do not appear to be properly credited. There is a lag time between when a gift is received at the parish or sent directly to the processing center, logged by the Archdiocese and deposited into the bank. Sometimes, all donations are not recorded before the next notice is printed and mailed. Therefore, if you note discrepancies or omissions in transactions, it may be due to the processing lag time. These discrepancies should be cleared up by the next month's report. 40 DAYS FOR LIFE CAMPAIGN

From September 24 through November 2 parishes, organizations, and the faithful of the Archdiocese of Chicago, along with other Christians, will participate in "40 Days For Life", a national campaign of prayer, fasting, peaceful vigil and community outreach. During the 40 days individuals pray and fast for an end to abortion and continue to call upon local, state, and national leaders to protect all human life from conception to natural death. Parishes and individuals across Chicago maintain a prayerful presence 24 hours a day every day of the 40 days in front of an abortion facility to change hearts and save lives by creating a strong *Culture of Life* through the *Gospel of Life*.

For a seventh year the Archdiocese of Chicago will keep a peaceful, prayerful vigil at Albany Medical-Surgical Center (a late-term abortion facility) at 5086 N. Elston Avenue (Elston west of Cicero) in Chicago. **In support of this 40 day effort, St. Isaac Jogues and St. John Brebeuf Parishes are working together to provide prayer coverage on the Feast of the North American Martyrs, Sunday, October 19, from Midnight to Midnight.** This is a special opportunity for us to give witness to our faith in Christ and to our belief that human life is sacred and is to be respected and protected.


