

Last Sunday's Family Mass celebrated Catechetical Sunday. Many of the students from Religious Education, their parents and families thanked our catechists. They were commissioned to once again take up the call to echo the message of Jesus sharing the gift of our faith. This is our faith and we are proud to profess it as one.

We can see our communion with Christ and with one another when we gather around the Eucharist. After we reflected on the Liturgy of the Word, we shared our common faith by sharing our Creed (what we believe), sharing our needs and concerns in the petitions or Universal Prayer. We offered our financial gifts to our parish and food for the poor as we offered the gifts of bread and wine for Mass. These actions were a powerful message to show our desire for communion with Christ and each other, especially the poor.

This week's readings from Sacred Scripture challenge us about complacency. We can be too comfortable with ourselves. The Prophet Amos warns of the complacent lying upon beds of ivory. They will go first into exile. The revelry will be done away with. This is clearly seen in the Gospel according to Luke when Jesus tells the story of the rich man and Lazarus. There are big differences in these two men although initially they are close logically, just a door apart. The rich man is dressed in the best clothing, the poor man Lazarus is covered in sores. After their deaths, there is a great distance between them. Lazarus is at our door and reminds us of the constant and changing face of the poor, the face of poverty in the world today. We do not want to miss an opportunity to come together as we address the multiple aspects of poverty. We see it in the lack of adequate money, resources, poverty of spirit. We can see it in the lack of adequate water, food, malnutrition, shelter, health care, jobs, education and morality. To follow Jesus, is to recognize his face in the poor, outcast, homeless and hopeless.

This is an important time to unite around the mission of Christ and the call of renewal. We want to be aware that we are different now, no longer two separate parishes but one with a new name: All Saints Parish is fortunate to be blest with two locations: St. Martha and St. Isaac Jogues. This reality helps us to widen our vision of what we know as our Church. Our parish, our church facilities in both locations are undergoing some renewal of our facilities. The St. Isaac Jogues Church renovation is underway. The St. Martha Rectory (repairing bathrooms, some windows, wall and floors) is currently underway and soon the St. Martha Church carpeting the little church will commence. Funding was set aside for the purpose of this rejuvenation.

Thank you for your continued support of All Saints Parish. We really rely upon your generous support. May God bless you and your family.
