THE SEVEN SORROWS OF MARY

October 5th, 3:00 p.m.



*“Through her heart, His sorrow sharing
All His bitter anguish bearing . . . “*

-The Stabat Mater

During the decades following the Second Vatican Council there was an observable shift in popular Catholic attitudes toward worship. The stress was liturgical, not devotional. There were excesses in the zeal to “retire” prayer books and rosaries and move statues out and banners in. There were reports of a newly ordained priest tearing a rosary apart in the pulpit and a reform driven pastor who had the “sacred heart” planed off of a statue of Jesus! That was ironic symbolism - “religion without a heart”! What often took its place was “Religion Lite” - - a warm, fuzzy, “feel good” take on the Gospel. All the while, some clung to novenas and other devotions. Devotion did not die!

As a newly ordained priest in 1970, I was assigned to what was considered a progressive city parish. St. Philomena had a tastefully renovated Gothic church. The choir had been disbanded because the former associate pastor “decreed” that choirs were no longer needed. There were cantors and a Guitar Group. The Liturgy was surprisingly good thanks to a long tradition of participation and singing. The congregation remained prayerful. A survivor of the “old days” was a weekly Sorrowful Mother Novena.

It remained because it was led by the laity. Reading the novena booklet, I concluded, “This isn’t bad.” The content was scripturally based and the “Seven Sorrows” drew me like a magnet. The meditations and prayers had a dated, emotion-charged prolixity that was out of touch with everyday experience. Could we offer a better version of the “Way of Sorrows”?

This was a task for the Liturgy Committee! On our committee was the wife of a local funeral director. She was sensitive, intelligent and a young mother. She and I worked together to write new meditations and prayers. In the process we made an interesting discovery. We were sharing our **experience** and our **faith**. Why couldn’t others do the same? Our version of a “Way of Sorrows” was not a perfect “fit” for everyone, but the form was flexible enough to engage people of different ages and backgrounds.

Last year our own Spiritual Life Commission and Liturgy Board invited parishioners to share their faith experience in reflections on the “Joys of Mary.” This year, on **Respect Life Sunday**, the reflections will again come from parishioners, but this time the focus will be the “Seven Sorrows.” The service will include visual art and music to complement the Scriptural readings and personal reflections.

Autumn is a season ideal to ponder the meaning and importance of suffering in union with Christ. It has been said that “the closer a Christian stands to his Lord, the nearer must he be to the Cross.” Mary was closest to the Cross. She was a co-sufferer of the Passion. Her own “sacrifice” was so great that it prompted St. Alphonsus Ligouri to say of the Sorrowful Mother “Two hung upon one cross.” Mary’s participation in the Passion of her divine Son was both **beata passio** (blessed suffering) and **passio amara** (bitter suffering).

Wherever there is suffering, it is only human to question “Why?” But wherever there is faith, hope and love, we receive an answer in the very Mystery of God’s Presence. Mary shows us the way.

One of the most heartfelt Psalm-prayers of a sick person reads, "I cry at night before you. Let my prayer come into your presence. O turn your ear to my cry." (Psalm 88:2-3) And, indeed, God does hear the cry of the poor sick person. The Anointing of the Sick is the sacramental assurance that God walks with us in our weakness and illness.

Those among us who are sick cry out to God, and they also cry out to us. When we celebrate the Anointing of the Sick with them, we assure them that we also walk with them. In our accompaniment of the sick, we follow Pope Francis, who urges us never to discard anyone, especially the poor, the sick, and the elderly. Our participation in this sacrament means that we hear their cry and affirm their value and dignity, especially in their vulnerability.
