

Ten were cleansed, where are the other nine?

That is the question Jesus is still asking today! Of the many multitudes He has cleansed and made whole, only a remnant are drawn back to Him! So where are all the others? Why was it that nine out of the ten did not come back to say thanks? Could this be the reason? What they had been through was so painful and humiliating that they wanted to leave it all behind from the very moment they were cured. They were well now; they were anxious to get on with their lives. They said, "I've got to get back to my wife and family. I want my self-respect back, as though they had never been ill.

The nine got what they were looking for and realized that they were now healed. They did not need Jesus anymore. This was indeed understandable, and yet the nine missed out on something precious that the tenth leper received. His cure was complete in a way theirs was not. This man knew where to worship God, where God really dwelt. And where God really dwelt was in Jesus Christ. That was the real temple. Jesus is the true temple. God doesn't dwell in Jerusalem, He dwells in Jesus. And he knows it. And he also knows that God offers more than just a physical healing. That isn't the real issue in his life, that's only a temporal detail. He returns not just to be thankful for a healing. He returns to seek what his soul really desired and needed, salvation.

Was there ever a time in your life when you felt like the ten lepers before they were cured? Their situation was desperate. They had a problem to which there seemed to be no solution - there was no known cure for leprosy at that time. Because the illness was considered to be highly contagious, lepers were isolated from their family and community.

Their plight may remind you of a time when you felt hopeless and all alone. This may have been caused by failure in an exam, or by an emotional illness, a pregnancy outside of marriage, an addiction that came to light, a crime that brought you before the court, or dismissal from a job. Your prayer may have been like theirs: 'Jesus, take pity on me! If you have come through such a crisis you may be able to look back now and see that your urgent prayer was answered. It may have been answered suddenly as the lepers' prayer was, or it may have been answered over a lengthy period of time. The help or healing may have come to you directly from God or through good people who were there for you.

Let us never take for granted the goodness of God whose generosity always outpours in abundance and the kindness of others; it is good to be grateful for all such loving assistance. And it is important that we let them know of our appreciation. Our quiet sincere expression to benefactors may be to them a needed tonic of encouragement along the narrow way. And our spirit of gratitude will be a factor in that character development which God desires in us. May our lives be lives of thankfulness and praise in every part: first to God for all the riches of His grace; and towards all whose love and kindness enrich our lives.

JOIN US in praying the Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary near the flagpole in front of St Isaac Jogues School.




RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

RESPECT LIFE MONTH: INCLUSION SUNDAY

-- One of the marks of the Church is that we are catholic – welcoming of everyone. Each year Inclusion Sunday affirms efforts being made to ensure that "every person, regardless of ability, is offered the same respect and opportunity to participate with other parishioners in their place of worship." Everyone has gifts to offer (being present, praying, singing, proclaiming, teaching, etc.) and those gifts make each of us and our whole faith community stronger!



-- Some considerations for disability etiquette:

- When talking to someone with a disability, speak directly to that person.
- If you don't lean or hang on to people in general, then don't lean or hang onto someone's walker or wheelchair. Walkers and wheelchairs are extensions of personal space for people who use them.
- When talking with a person in a wheelchair for more than a few minutes, place yourself at the wheelchair user's eye level to spare both of you a stiff neck.
- Offer assistance to a person with a disability if you want to, but wait until your offer is accepted before you help and listen to any instructions the person may want to give.
- Be considerate of the extra time it might take for a person with a disability to get things done or said. Let the person set the pace in walking and talking.
- People with disabilities are entitled to the same courtesies that you extend to anyone. This includes their personal privacy.
- Relax and don't be embarrassed if you happen to use an accepted, common expression such as, "See you later," or "I've got to be running along," that seems to relate to the person's disability.
- When you are unsure of what to do in a situation with someone with a disability, it is okay to admit you are unsure and ask the person for advice.
- -- Prayer for Awareness: God, Creator of all, help us to recognize that each of us has abilities and each of us has limitations. And yet we all have a part to play in bringing about Your Kingdom. You love each of us profoundly. In the spirit of gratitude and solidarity, we ask you to increase our awareness of both the gives and the needs of those around us. Open our hearts, minds and doors to the gifts of every person. Help us to become truly welcoming communities where everyone can find a place at Your Table. We ask this in the name of Jesus the Lord. Amen.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Last year, in speaking to a conference in Rome, Pope Francis reminded the participants that "the vocation to the priesthood is a gift that God gives to some for the good of all." This weekend as we celebrate and pray for our own seminarians in the Archdiocese of Chicago, I ask you once again for your financial support of them.

We currently have sixty-seven seminarians preparing for a life of service as your future pastors. Their motivation and enthusiasm for serving in the Church through a life-long commitment is inspiring to us all, promoting us to offer in return our prayers, fraternal encouragement and financial support. Many of you have personally told me how much you enjoy meeting our seminarians whenever they visit parishes and I know you come away from those experiences with a renewed sense of hope for the future.

We in turn as a community need to stand with them during their years of preparation and for this reason I invite you to join with me in making this year's seminarian collection a great success. Contributions made to this collection alleviate monthly expenses such as tuition and fees (\$1,850), room and board (\$950), formation programs (\$250), and health insurance (\$190) for each seminarian and will be used solely for the formation of new priests for the Archdiocese of Chicago. You may make a one-time donation no less than your weekly contribution to your parish, or establish a monthly contribution to the collection. Your gift, whatever the amount, will have a great impact on our seminarians, as they see first-hand your willingness to stand in solidarity with them.

During the *Renew My Church* consultation, one of the top priorities identified was the need to promote vocations to the priesthood. We are doing everything possible in this regard, but I do need your support through prayer and donations to the seminarian collection.

Thank you for your commitment to our seminarians. You can rely on me joining you in prayer for them as well as my remembrance of your needs as I thank God for your many gifts.
