



**THANKSGIVING EVE: Interreligious Service**

November is the Month of the Holy Souls. It is also a month when Americans celebrate a secular holiday with deep religious roots. While the emphasis has shifted to feasting and football, Thanksgiving still inspires religious feelings. The ritual of bowed heads and table grace may be a nod to nostalgia and tradition, but it is often much more than that! Thanksgiving is a remembrance of God's mercy - - an encounter with the Holy. The "pilgrim fathers" were convinced that God had saved them from drought and starvation. That is why they gave thanks, why they feasted, and why they played games. Thanksgiving then was not a celebration of self-satisfied abundance, it was a celebration of God's bounty. It was an acknowledgement of answered prayers!

Thanksgiving has a "Mayflower" pedigree. There is a distinct Protestant flavor to its origins. But, through the centuries and with waves of immigration, Thanksgiving has been adopted and adapted by people of different cultures and religions. In that, Thanksgiving is a most accommodating feast!

Thanksgiving stresses the holiness of God and the blessings of the harvest. Jews, Muslims, Hindus, Buddhists as well as Christians instinctively want to thank God. A growing, beautiful custom is celebrating an Ecumenical or Interreligious Service on Thanksgiving Eve. I am happy to say that I have been part of such celebrations since I was ordained in 1970.

This year, local clergy and laity will observe **Thanksgiving Eve (Nov. 23rd) at The Morton Grove Mosque (8601 N. Menard Ave.) at 7:30 PM.** All are welcome to participate.

Please consider attending the presentation on Islam

next Sunday, November 20th in the Holy Family Room at 3:00 PM. Jason Renken & Azam Nizamuddin will explore "Thanksgiving and Service from the Muslim & Catholic Perspectives".

Why should you consider attending this presentation and participating in the Interreligious Thanksgiving Service? A scholar of world religions, Leonard J. Biallas, has an excellent answer:

*"There are spiritual riches buried in the innermost recesses of our own religions that are only opened up to us when we encounter what is strange and different in other traditions."*

Our first "encounter" with other traditions can be the beginning of better self-understanding and real dialogue. That dialogue can enable us to compare and contrast how human nature and the human condition are perceived. Life, love, compassion, destiny and death ... how much do we share in common? How much comes from a different vantage or perspective?



It was Pope Pius XI who once said: "If we are to love each other, we must first know each other." I would add something commonplace, but essential, to that: "To know each other, we must first meet each other." The Thanksgiving Eve Service can inaugurate an ongoing dialogue with other religious people. That can contribute much toward peace in our own communities and ultimately in the world.



**NEW TRANSLATION OF THE ROMAN MISSAL**

Next weekend we will take a few minutes to review the word changes for the Mass, which we will begin to say the First Sunday of Advent. At that time the Third Edition of the Roman Missal will become the prayer book for our public worship. In preparation of that use, we will bless the new Roman Missal during Masses also next weekend.

After the Creed (which we reviewed last week) and Prayer of the Faithful we now begin the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Having prepared the gifts the Priest says: "Pray, brothers and sisters that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father." We rise and reply:

**May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church."**

The Eucharistic Prayer, the Great Prayer of Thanksgiving, begins with the following dialogue:  
The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.** Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right and just.**

One of the biggest changes in this part of the Mass is what is prayed after the consecration. It used to be called the Memorial Acclamation and will now be called The Mystery of Faith. Joyful acclamations burst forth from people because of something wondrous and great. One does not need to be invited to acclaim what they have seen or experienced. So "Let us proclaim the mystery of faith" now will be "The Mystery of Faith". This is similar to "The Word of the Lord" and "The Body of Christ" What has happened, what has been heard, what we are receiving is even more than the action that has taken place, the book from which the words are read, the communion we share. Three new acclamations are provided (one of which we have been singing for several weeks) for our response. In these acclamations, which are addressed to God, we proclaim again our participation, our incorporation if you will, into the Paschal Mystery (the death and resurrection) of Jesus Christ. **"We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again."**  
**"When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your death, O Lord, until you come again."**  
**"Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free."** You will note that **"Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again"** is no longer one of the options. This one in particular was never in the Latin. It is not an acclamation, but rather is more of a mini statement of belief. Let us pray for God's grace to help us pray and worship well all that we believe and profess!







**'Poverty, Thanksgiving, Generosity, and Joy'**

As we anticipate Jesus' coming at Christmas in a humble stable, let us explore the beatitude "Blessed are the poor."

**Monday, November 14**  
**7:00 P.M. - 8:00 P.M.**

Poverty, chastity, and obedience are called the "evangelical counsels." They are the promises or vows made by members of religious orders. However, these counsels or virtues are not only for a few. They are meant for all of us. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Christ proposes the evangelical counsels, in their great variety, to every disciple" (CCC 915). You and I are to live the counsels but taking into account that we are to live in the world and provide for our families and for others under our authority (employees, the poor, etc.).

This talk examines one of the counsels—poverty.

Following the presentation there will be a question and answer period and a chance to purchase signed copies of Regis's new book *God's on the Phone: Stories of Grace and Action*, along with several of his other titles.

**Regis Flaherty** is a retreat center director and a best-selling author of seven books. He has over 35 years of experience in working with Catholic organizations. His articles have appeared in national and diocesan publications and he has appeared on several radio and television programs. He is a frequent speaker to Catholic gatherings on the topic of lay spirituality and along with his wife, Libbie, teaches pre-marriage and marriage enrichment classes.

**BULLETIN SICK LIST**

The sick and hospitalized are to be held in thought and prayer. For their family, friends, and faith community it is often times the best, and sometimes even only, way we can help and support them. Yet we must remember that by law we cannot publicly let our parish community know the health status of any of our members without their permission. What that means is that we cannot put people’s names in the bulletin sick list for prayer without permission.

As a reminder our policy is as follows: Names for the sick list in the bulletin have to be called in by the person who is ill or by a member of their family. At the time they call in the name they will be asked whether they are the sick person him/herself, or a member of their family and if they give permission for the name to be placed on the list. They will be asked for the correct spelling of the sick person’s name. If a family member, they will be required to give their name for our records. The name will be in the bulletin for one month.

Then the person’s name will be inscribed in the Book of Community Prayer. All people and prayer requests are remembered during the petitions at all the weekend Masses. Their names will also be given to our Ministers of Praise to pray for them daily.
