First Sunday of Advent

Where will you be ?

This was the question that was on a big advertisement in the window of a store downtown. There was also an image in Time's Square in New York City on New Year's eve with the question "where will you be?"

As the new liturgical year begins with the Advent, we may ask ourselves where are we? Are we happy to have an opportunity to refresh our relationship with Christ Jesus and others? Sometimes our first task of a new year involves breaking through some of our anxiety, as we might worry and anticipate all kinds of problems that may or may not ever happen. Where will we be? That is a good question. Where will you be on New Year's Eve but more importantly where are we now? Where are we now as we begin a new church year and this first Sunday of Advent?

In a time after Thanksgiving when we face the realities of leftover food, we do not want to be left behind in a swirl of busyness of events and feasts with family and friends. We don't want to be left behind as we begin a new year together.

It is important for us as we gathered around the Advent wreath to see the evergreen wreath reminding us of the enduring love of God, who loved the world, that God gave us his Son. Each Sunday in Advent we light a candle, remembering to keep our faith in Christ burning brightly. This Advent we will have many opportunities to glow and grow in faith. This is our beginning, a reboot, a new start to light our faith. Advent can be our special time of jump-starting our prayers and growing in our relationship with Christ through the celebration of the sacraments like Reconciliation and the Eucharist. In our Opening Prayer or Collect at Mass there is an image of running. We are not running away but running forward to meet Christ with righteous deeds. The Closing Prayer or Post Communion Prayer is equally meaningful: "May these mysteries profit us for even now as we walk amid passing things you teach us by them to love the things of heaven."

Where are we now? Where will you be when Christ comes again? Perhaps Jesus is inviting us to bravely awaken from our slumber and welcome him with a lively faith.

I look forward to sharing this enriching time of Advent activities before Christmas with you and your family.

CHRISTMAS WREATH AND DÉCOR SALE TODAY



Our New Relic of St. Malachy

Malachy (Mael Maedoc) O'More (Ua Morgair) was born in Armagh in 1094. He was raised under the care of the famous recluse Imhar O'Hagan and ordained a priest by St. Cellach (Celsus) in 1119. He continued his studies in Lismore under St. Malchus. In 1124, he was ordained bishop of Connor. He continued to reside at Bangor and when some of the naive princes attacked Bangor and Connor, he led the monks to King Cormac of Munster and founded Iveragh monastery in Kerry. In 1132, he succeeded St. Celsus as archbishop of Armagh. But, owing to intrigues, he was unable to take possession of his see for two years; even then, he had to purchase the important relic and sign of his authority - the "Jesus Staff" - from Niall, the usurping lay primate. He then set about restoring the discipline of the Irish Church and adopting the Roman liturgy at Armagh. In 1138, he resigned and retired to Connor, dividing his diocese in two: Down and Connor. He founded a priory of Augustinian canons at Downpatrick. Early in 1129, on a journey to Rome, he stopped at Clairvaux and met its abbot, St. Bernard. They became life-long friends. Pope Innocent II appointed him apostolic legate for Ireland, with ample power to correct existing abuses. In 1142, he opened the first Irish Cistercian abbey at Mellifont. His greatest act was the convocation of the Synod of Inis-Padraig, held in 1148. 15 bishops, 200 priests, and many religious were present at the deliberations, which lasted four days. After the Synod, Malachy set out for a return visit to Rome. But, upon arriving at Clairvaux, he fell sick and died in the arms of St. Bernard on November 1, 1148. He was buried in the chapel at Clairvaux. St. Bernard would eventually be buried near him. Numerous miracles are recorded and attributed to him. He was canonized by Pope Clement III on July 6, 1199.

Malachy's and Bernard's tombs were moved several times with the rebuilding of the church. Portions of Malachy's remains were sent to Mellifont in 1194. At some time at Clairvaux, part of Malachy's arm and his skull were removed and placed in special reliquaries in the abbey's treasury. His arm was kept in a silver case, decorated with precious stones. A portion of his skull was kept in a bust reliquary of gilt silver, also decorated with precious stones and topped by a mitre. These reliquaries may have been enameled or painted. During the French Revolution, the reliquaries themselves were destroyed, although the relics were preserved. Malachy's head is now preserved in a reliquary in the treasury of Troyes Cathedral, not far from the ruins of Clairvaux. The tombs of the two friends were destroyed in the aftermath of the revolution, and the bones were commingled and distributed to various parishes in the district of Clairvaux. Fortunately for us, our bone of St. Malachy was certified and sealed by Cardinal Francesco Barberini the Younger in Rome on May 5, 1735 - long before the French Revolution. So it probably came directly from his as-yet-undisturbed relics in Clairvaux.

ADVENT

“For You O Lord, my soul in stillness waits; truly my hope is in You.”

*And with these words Advent begins, a season of expectant hope and joy during which we await the coming of Jesus – past, present, and future. While the season remains the same as it has over the centuries, we have some changes in our parish celebrations. As we honor and share traditions, let us also share in a prayer-filled season of hope and renewal!

*St. Martha Church is now decorated with purple instead of the blue to which we have been accustomed for awhile. Advent is a season of hope, it is also a season during which we are called to repent as John the Baptist exhorts us to make straight our paths.

*A Jesse Tree, a tradition shared by St. Isaac Jogues, is in the narthex of the large church at St. Martha and at St. Isaac Jogues. The Jesse Tree is the family tree, the ancestry of Jesus and our salvation history. It originated in the Middle Ages in stained glass windows to teach and share the faith. In Isaiah 11:1 Jesus is referred to as a shoot coming up from the stump of Jesse, the father of the King David. Scripture also says that the Messiah will be of the house of David. So when Joseph, who is of the line of David, takes Mary into his home and accepts the child she is carrying Jesus becomes part of King David's lineage. Each week more ornaments w/ scripture verse (worked on by the RE families) will be added to the Jesse Trees and our prayer corner will invite you to learn more about each person or event, as you pray your way through this season of preparation and expectation.



*The Angels Tree will be available in December. St. Martha shares this tradition with St. Isaac Jogues. If you would like to donate an angel ornament in memory of a deceased loved one, you are invited to bring it and hang it on the tree.

*We will ready the manger during the Fourth Week of Advent for the Christ Child to rest. Strips of material will symbolize our charitable acts.

All are welcome to The Shrine of All Saints

The mission of the Shrine is to provide a place for relics to “come to rest” and to share their stories and history with all who are interested. The saints show us how to live our faith. The saints are always with us to help us pray. The saints are always there to intercede on our behalf. Honoring our responsibility of evangelization and faith formation, the Shrine has been very busy over the past few months. We have several trained docents who conduct tours on an appointment basis. Following are some facts about our visitors since July 1st.

10 schools have visited, many with their confirmation Classes from Oak Forest to Wadsworth and a group of pilgrims from St. Louis, Missouri.

6 church groups including a Vietnamese Eucharistic Youth Group, Senior groups, Holy Name Cathedral Padre Pio Prayer Group and a number of other prayer & rosary groups.

We have hosted visitors from 5 different countries and 17 states.

On average we have 10 tours per month and have seen over 500 students and pilgrims. Here's a sample of the comments received: “Wow, every Catholic should visit” and “Amazing - Beautiful - This is the history of our faith - beyond important!” “It is a blessing to visit this wonderful place. God bless all of you. Thanks”, “Can't wait to return.”

ADVENT PRAYER CORNER

Sunday – Bless your Advent Wreath or Advent candle today with this prayer: Lord, we gather around this symbol of our waiting for you. May the never-ending circle of this wreath and its evergreen branches remind us of the eternal life you came to bring us. May the flames of these candles remind us of the light you bring into the darkness of our own sin and of our troubled world. Bless this wreath and those who look at it during this Advent Season. Let it be a sign of hope and a challenge to prepare our hearts for your coming: at the end of time, your various ‘comings’ in our daily lives and at Christmas. Amen. (Sprinkle it with holy water if you have some.) Reread today’s Gospel, Matthew 24:37-44. If alone, write down a few ways you will prepare for the Lord’s coming this Advent. If with family/friends, share what you’ll do.

(Each day this week light the first candle of your Advent Wreath or just light a single candle. Take a quiet moment. When ready, make the Sign of the Cross and say this week’s prayer – Creator God, you made us with a desire to share your divine life, and through the coming of Jesus, you have satisfied that desire. As we prepare for the great celebration of Christmas, may our hearts once again be filled with desire for the life of Christ within us. May the Spirit of Jesus stir us anew with charity toward all people, especially those most in need. And may we know the joy of your coming into our lives as Lord and Healer, Redeemer and Brother. Amen.

Read the Jesse Tree Scripture for the day and reflect on and/or discuss the day’s question.

Monday: Creation (tree branch) – “In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth....and found it very good.” Gen. 1:1-31; 2:1-4. Jesus’ ancestry began with God’s great love and desire to share that love. What part of creation most helps you experience God’s love for you? Why?

Tuesday: Adam & Eve – “It is not good for the man to be alone...this one shall be called woman.” Gen. 2:7-9, 18-24 Who were/are the people who have helped you believe in God and grow in faith?

Wednesday: Serpent – “She took some of its fruit and ate it; and she also gave some to her husband...and he ate it...God banished him from the garden of Eden. Gen. 3:1-7, 23-24 Who or what draws you away from following/obeying the will of God?

Thursday: Noah (ark) – “God remembered Noah and all the animals, wild and tame, that were with him in the ark....I will never again strike down every living being, as I have done.” Gen. 6:5-8, 13-22, 8:1, 6-22 Think of a time when you felt God gave you a new chance.

Friday: Abraham (stars) – “I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you...All the families of the earth will find blessing in you.” Gen. 12:1-3 How have you shared your faith/gifts to bless someone else?

Saturday: Isaac (ram) – “Abraham, Abraham! Do not lay your hand on the boy...For now I know that you fear God, since you did not withhold from me your son, your only one.” Gen. 22:1-4 Recall a time when you felt God was asking you to do something really difficult and to trust Him. Did you? Why or why not?

Faith in Action This Week (*Choose at least one of these actions or one you come up with*) – Pray for people who need a new chance (migrants, those in prison, those who feel separated from God or the Church). Help an elderly neighbor snow shoveling, decorating, or whatever other chore they might need done. Sign a few of your extra Christmas Cards with All Saints Parish, bring them to either worship site and place in box marked MOC Christmas Cards. The Ministers of Care will then bring the cards to those they visit in their homes and at the five senior living and/or nursing centers they serve. Cards needed by Dec. 19.


